A **BUDGET** is a plan on how to spend the money you have over a specific length of time.

WHAT IS THE NATIONAL **BUDGET?**

In FEBRUARY each year, the Minister of Finance announces the The national budget divides money between national departments, provinces, and municipalities. **NATIONAL BUDGET.**The Minister tells everyone how government collects money and its plans on how to spend it over the next 3 YEARS.

WHY DOES THE GOVERNMENT **NEED TO BUDGET?**

- To make better choices with money
- To manage our spending habits
- To keep track of our expenses
- To prepare for emergencies
- To pay off our debt
- To achieve our goals

Just like how you save and spend your own money, but for the whole country.

REVENUE — **EXPENDITURE**

- Taxes such as **PERSONAL AND CORPORATE INCOME TAXES AND VALUE-**ADDED TAX

- NON-TAX REVENUE

e.g. departmental receipts and **SALE OF** CAPITAL ASSETS.



Non-interest Expenditure

Interest payments

If revenue equals expenditure this is a balanced budget. If revenue exceeds expenditure this will be a budget surplus. If expenditure exceeds revenue, government is running a deficit and has to borrow.



There is a limit to how much can be borrowed and it comes at a cost (INTEREST PAYMENTS)



DID YOU KNOW?



INTEREST PAYMENTS: government pays interest on its debt and other costs related to its borrowing.



MONEY USED FOR IN 2024/25?

The money **COLLECTED** is used by the government to do many **IMPORTANT THINGS** such as:





helps ensure everyone can access health care services fairly.



CONTINGENCY RESERVE

RS billion

is set aside for changes to the economic enviroment and to meet unforeseeable spending pressures



R74.7 billion

helps create a government that supports growth and positive change, as planned in the National Development Plan.





LEARNING & CULTURE

R480.6 billion

includes basic and higher education, plus training, sports, arts, and culture.

SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT

R387.3 billion

helps people get financial aid and services to reduce poverty and support those in need.

DEBT-SERVICE COSTS

R382.2 billion

is the **cost of borrowing money**, that is interest on government debt



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

R265.3 billion

supports access to housing and basic services, affordable public transport, and spatial transformation urban development.



PEACE & SECURITY

TOTAL GOVERNEMNT SPENDING R 2.37 TRILLION

R244 billion

funds the criminal justice system and safety and security to ensure territorial integrity.



ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

R255.4 billion

helps the economy grow and reduces unemployment, poverty, and inequality

SOCIAL GRANTS

Total social grant spending makes up 11% of total government spending in 2024/25.
